The first section in this book of miscellany – Anecdotes – contains the account of a learned spaniel exhibited at York, and of Doctor Mantaccini, a "French Quack" who claimed to perform resurrections. Other chapters include Antiquities, Arithmetic, Biographical Notes (containing a report on the Paisley Witches), Magic Squares, and Genealogical Paradoxes. Compiled anonymously, and "Published by the Editor of the Paisley Repository... author of History of the Witches of Renfrewshire."

Scot committed a daring act in publishing The Discoverie of Witchcraft, which notwithstanding its content was, as H. Adrian Smith noted, "itself a heresy" as he did so without the approval of a bishop. Expecting the work would be censored should it appear before a bishop, Smith continued, "He took the full responsibility and blame on his own shoulders and had the book printed himself in 1584. No stationer's name appeared in it, and the printer's name appeared only at the end of the book, without date or place of address." Recent scholarship has provided further clarity, with the historian Simon During noting that the printer, William Brome, was a dealer in conjuring devices and blow books in St. Paul's Churchyard, and that these "connections with the magic trade enabled [Scot] to present the conjuring practices of his time in unprecedented profusion."

While mainly devoted to the archaeological and architectural antiquities found in Paris, the work touches on witchcraft, including the account of a heretic monk condemned for practicing magic (Thorndike, History of Magic and Experimental Science Vol. 3, 21).

According to Milbourne Christopher, "January 16, 1749 was a night long remembered by the Londoners who jammed into the New Theatre in the Haymarket, a night much discussed in the annals of British drama." Advertising material made the fantastic claim that a man would squeeze himself inside an ordinary wine bottle as part of his conjuring entertainment. But as curtain time came and went, an already skeptical crowd grew restless. When the performer failed to appear, a riot broke out. A lit candle was thrown on stage and the curtains caught fire, eventually leading to the total destruction of the theatre. 
FINE BINDINGS

Books in the following section have been grouped under a separate heading for the physical beauty they share and, in many cases, on the basis that such a significant investment in the presentation of the work has rarely, if ever, been undertaken. He was one of many well-known magicians to perform on Chautauqua circuits, which toured rural America from roughly 1900 – 1930. He also served as editor of Mahatma, the first American magic periodical. For the last several years of his life, Ducrot worked in New York City where he owned and operated the Hornmann Magic Co. On Ducrot's death, the business was purchased by Al Flosso.



Perhaps the most famous spirit medium of Victorian England, D.D. Home's reputation grew based on his ability to apparently speak to the dead, levitate to varying heights, and produce spirit rappings at will. The phenomena he produced were sufficiently realistic to convince scores of witnesses of his powers. In fact, the owner of the hotel from which this letter was mailed, William Cox, allowed Home to live in his establishment at no charge, so strong was his belief. Houdini wrote extensively about the medium in his book A Magician Among the Spirits. Contemporary critics and proponents of Home's included Thackeray, Browning, Trollope, Napoleon III, Michael Faraday, and Queen Sophia of The Netherlands.

In the end, however, it was Howard Thurston who succeeded Kellar, not Valadon.
