

1. Mills 1 Cent Wizard Fortune Teller. Chicago: Mills Novelty Co., ca. 1926. Tabletop fortune telling machine in wooden cabinet, window with working question lever, coin slot and push-button on side which activates inner reel that displays your humorous fortune (e.g., "Am I Going to Marry?" "Yes! Lots of times!"). 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 6 x 18 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Working. Lock and keys included. Some paint loss to front, otherwise very good. 1,000/1,500

2. Mills 1 Cent Target Practice Skill Game Trade Stimulator. Chicago, ca. 1920s. Cast aluminum and wooden countertop coin flip game with pin-field. One attempts to win gum or up to 25 cents in trade. Original paper insert. 17 x 12 x 7". With lock and keys.

9. D. Robbins & Co. Criss Cross 1 Cent Ball Gum Vendor. Circa 1939. Penny gum vendor and skill game machine, metal and wood with glass front. The player presses the round button to shoot the gumball into the play area, and tries to line up three balls. With back door; lock removed. 16 $\frac{3}{4} \times 9 \frac{1}{4} \times 9 \frac{1}{4}$ ". 400/600

10. Superior 1 Cent Trade Stimulator. Columbus, OH: Superior Confection Company, n.d., ca. 1930s. Wooden cabinet, painted cast iron front. 3 reels with cigarette brands, gumball dispenser; with "You Cheated Me!!!" sign when a slug is inserted. With display window with later display sheet and later manufacturer's stickers on sides. 8 x 11 x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Professionally restored. With keys. Working.

11. Rock-Ola 1 Cent "The Official Sweepstakes" Countertop Steeplechase Game. Chicago: Rock-Ola Manufacturing Corporation, ca. 1933-35. With later marble substituting for original ball. 15 x 13 x 12". Some occasional wear, soiling, painted trim on sides of cabinet mostly lacking, with "City of Seattle ... When a penny is inserted into the gun at front and shot, one of 3 targets knocks over, and a gumball is dispensed below. With knob that resets targets and another knob to dispense gum. 9 1/2 x 23 x 18 1/2". Some agewear. Working (gum dispenser untested).

32. Keep 'em Bombing 1 Cent Countertop Penny Drop Machine. Atlas Novelty, 1940s. World War II-era game with patriotically decorated cabinet, stating "the owner...has pledged himself to purchase U.S. Defense Stamps and Bonds with his share of the income" from the machine. Play field depicts bombing of a Japanese military base, titled "smack a Jap" on front of cabinet. 21 x 12 1/2 x 10 1/2". With key. A scarce, unrestored machine with wear consistent with age. 800/1,200

33. Jennings 1 Cent "The Favorite" Ball Gum Arcade Machine. Chicago, 1926. Coin-flip and gumball vending machine in a large cabinet accommodating the gumball machine, with side windows, painted cast aluminum front with horse racing imagery. 19 ¹/₂ x 14 x 13". Working condition. With keys. 1,000/1,500

34. A.B.T. Mfg. Big Game Hunter Shooting Gallery 1 Cent Arcade Game. Chicago, ca. 1930s. Wooden cabinet with cast and painted aluminum front and marquee. Five shots for a penny: hit the target and a reel above spins to an image of an animal. 26 x 18 x 10". Working. Marquee without screws. 1,200/1,800

35. A.B.T. Mfg. Try Your Skill 1 Cent Pistol Shooting Gallery Arcade Game. Chicago, ca. 1940s. Stencil painted wooden cabinet with chromed top and Masonite marquee. Shooting gallery delivers 10 shots for a penny and rotating mechanical targets. 28 x 26 x 10". Working, with keys.

36. A.B.T. Mfg. Target Skill 1 Cent Shooting Gallery Countertop Arcade Game. Chicago, ca. 1930s. 38. Target Practice 1 Cent Shooting Gallery Pistol Arcade Game. Circa 1930s-40s. Dark wooden cabinet with marguee and old paper insert. 39. Hance Penny Back Target Practice Machine. Westerville, OH: The Hance Manufacturing Co., [n.d., ca. 1920s]. Cast iron painted or chrome-plated fascia, with original metal mechanism, in recent wooden and glass cabinet, and with modern lock and key. Metal pieces fully restored and painted, with later display card. When a penny is inserted in the gun and fired, the penny goes into the machine if the player fails to get the penny into the target at the back of the machine; if the player gets the penny into the target, the penny is returned to the player from the slot at the side. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 19 x 15 ¼". Working.

40. Star Vending "Hit Hitler" Shooting Gallery 1 Cent Arcade Machine. Circa 1940s. Wooden, cast aluminum, and glass countertop shooting gallery with a target of Hitler applied at end of the cabinet. A shot into Hitler's mouth would return your penny for another shot, and misses would vend a gumball. 17 ¹/₂ x 20 x 9". 42. "Electric Sailor Machine" Painted Cast Iron Figure. Leipzig: Polyphon Musikwerke, ca. 1910. Sailor with two (apparently later) painted wooden arms on metal pins, each hand with a flag pole (one flag is present, the other is missing), holes in each eye as issued. Back of sailor is plain painted wood. Arms swing freely. Coin slot on sailor's shirt on his left side. 18 3/4" high, 11 1/2" wide. Some wear, scuffing, no electric mechanism present. Originally, this figure was on a metal base. When a coin (some examples of this were fitted for an American nickel) was inserted into the sailor's coin slot, he would wink (via lights in his eyes) and would deliver a "fun" electric shock when his right arm was pushed back and the left was held (arms were originally metal). Although the present lot has had his mechanism and base removed and his arms apparently replaced, it is still quite rare.

43. Bally Mfg. Co. 5 Cent "Have a Stein of Beer on Bosco" Trade Stimulator. Chicago: Bally Mfg. Co., ca. 1933. Countertop electric dice game; when a nickel is deposited the tray rotates three dice - when the plunger is depressed, the game stops and the numbers on the die indicate the displayed prize on the printed paper prize sheet (included). Wooden cabinet, glass top. 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ x 13 x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Key and tip of plunger missing, electric mechanism requires adjustment, glass cover prevents coin from being deposited (requires adjustment). Good. Rare.
