



INTRODUCTION

his second auction catalogue offers further insight into the scope and scale of the Dawes Collection. Eddie and Amy Dawes spent some seven decades diligently acquiring items related to magic and its allied arts. From its inception, with J.C. Cannell's *The Master Book of Magic*, acquired from the Quaker Oats Company as a youth through diligent porridge consumption, it was the desire for knowledge, to understand magicians, their skills, and their place in history, which influenced and spurred continual additions to the Collection. There was an enthusiasm for researching and "discovering" lesser-known performers, and for making local geographic associations. They were historians and, in an age pre-dating digitised library archives and comprehensive databases, this meant acquiring books, ephemera and apparatus for future research. *The Rich Cabinet of Magical Curiosities* which first appeared in the Magic Circular in 1972 was inspired and sustained by items from within the Collection.

As academics and educators by profession, Eddie and Amy jointly shared an enthusiasm and a passion for knowledge, combined with the willingness to share. They were active participants in magical societies, effective organisers of events such as The Magic Circle Collectors' Day and society Annual Dinners, as well as devotees of Magic Conventions and Collectors' Symposia in Britain, Europe and North America. Their hospitality was well-known, and an invitation to their long-time Yorkshire home, "Dane Hill", was widely recognized as a culinary and bibliophilic pleasure. Although some of the Collection was on display, much was carefully preserved, stored flat in plan chests, light-free cupboards, and aided by the expedient solution of double-stacked bookshelves.

The Dawes Collection was built through smaller purchases. Booksellers' catalogues delivered to the Hull University Library proved a fertile source of material. Local auctions in Yorkshire yielded theatrical broadsheets and scarce early playbills. Frequent and methodical visits to regional bookshops also helped fill the shelves. Book dealer, Andrew Block, who acquired The Ivory Collection in the 1960s, was a source of Andersonian and other broadsheet materials.

Fellow collectors also proved willing to trade, and any duplicates acquired were exchanged for new additions to the "working library". Over time, friendships initially forged in Glasgow in the 1950s, with magic collectors Jimmy Findlay, Richard Armour and De Vega, were sources of new additions. Many of the Collection's treasured Houdini, Bland and Chung Ling Soo items were acquired from friends. A core element of the lithographic poster collection was acquired in 1968 from fellow-Yorkshireman, noted historian, and long-time collector Dick Ritson.

Importantly, the Collection provided the bulk of the source materials used for Eddie's books: *The Great Illusionists*, published by David & Charles in 1979, and the twenty-two subsequent conjuring books and monographs which followed. At its core, any Collection, irrespective of size is a reservoir of information both public and private. As a keen correspondent and researcher, magicians' correspondence held a particular fascination for Eddie and Amy since it permitted detailed insights into the individual concerned. In some instances, as with materials from Stanley Collins' widow Margaret, they became the genesis for the publication of further books (*Stanley Collins, Conjurer, Collector and Iconoclast* (2003)), complementing shorter articles previously written for the Rich Cabinet.


The Dawes Collection contained a wide variety of antiquarian books, posters, correspondence, apparatus, association pieces, and other ephemera, reflecting a broad definition and appetite for all things magic and allied arts related. It was principally an English-language-centric collection.

With the passage of time came inevitable questions of what would be the future for The Dawes Collection? Eddie considered himself a temporary, albeit long-lived, custodian of the items which made up his Collection. He was clear in his belief that future generations should in their turn share the pleasure and excitement of collecting these pieces. Hence his decision that The Dawes Collection should be disposed of by auction, rather than gifted to an institution.

By his analysis, any legacy accruing as a collector was secondary to the productive use of a collection to further knowledge of magic history. Furthermore, it was necessary to share and communicate that research as widely as possible. It was a responsibility he relished.

In his words, "Collect, Collate and Communicate."





3. BAMBERG, Theo. (Tobias Bamberg, 1875 – 1963). **Thurston Presents Theo Bamberg Europe's Great Shadowist.** Cincinnati: Strobridge Litho. Co., ca. 1908. Half sheet color stone lithograph bears a full-length portrait of Bamberg (Okito) and the hand shadows he presented as a specialty act on the Thurston show. 30 x 20". Linen backed. 
At the time this lithograph was printed, Bamberg — more widely known as Okito — was a guest artist on the Thurston show, performing his hand shadows as an interlude in the full-evening entertainment. Though remembered today as an inventive magician and peerless craftsman of magic apparatus, as a boy in his native Holland, Bamberg performed his hand shadow act for the nation's royal family. In 1908, after Thurston purchased the show of Harry Kellar, Bamberg was added to the program not only to lengthen the performance, but to also as a technical advisor. He would later return to vaudeville and European variety theatres as Okito the 'Asian' magician, topping bills and earning huge salaries. He died in Chicago in 1963.



4. BODIE, Dr. Walford (1869 – 1939). The Great and Only Dr. Walford Bodie. London & Birmingham: James Upton, ca. 1910. Stone lithograph depicts a lively trial scene in which Bodie passes 30,000 volts through his body in front of wig-clad judges and "an expert electrician" at the High Courts of London. The central image is complemented by vignettes of an electric chair, x-rays, a "cage of death," and "electric bombs," all part of Bodie's music hall show. $27 \frac{1}{2} \times 19$ ". Both conjurer and con man, Scottish-born "Dr." Walford Bodie practiced hypnotism, ventriloquism, and presented electrical experiments on stage as well as demonstrations of "bloodless surgery." This poster commemorates the great "Bodie Trial," in which he was sued for and lost a case for misrepresentation of his credentials. The image bears a striking resemblance to a famous Houdini poster depicting the escape artist's triumph in a Cologne courtroom in 1902.







Briggs is better remembered for his literary output than as a performer. He was born in Sheffield, England and left for Australia in 1911 where he worked as a dealer, published treatises on magic, and served as editor and publisher of several periodicals.





Soo's fire trick was a centerpiece of his stage show. The effect began with the magician lighting cotton wool and stuffing the burning material into his mouth. He then belched fire and smoke, and, eventually, produced a multitude of colorful ribbons, streamers, and even a long barber pole from the embers in his mouth. It has been said that while this comical poster captures the elastic-like poses he made during the performance of the feat, it also reveals a harsh reality: Soo's teeth were badly damaged and blackened by the trick, and thus none of the photographs on this poster show them to the viewer. Another view of the effect can be seen in the poster offered as the next lot.









According to Lafayette's own publicity material, the "one-act drama" in his show featuring the subject of his poster was a sinister tableaux incorporating not only incredible magical feats of appearance, disappearance, and "vivisection," but also incorporated a theme so central to his life, his dog.

"Dr. Kremser, the great hypnotic surgeon and vivisectionist, is faced with a terrible problem. His only daughter is on the point of death, suffering from a mysterious disease, the treatment of which the doctor is not acquainted with. He realizes that the only means of discovering the effect of a new operation is to 'try it on the dog'.

"It is night when he comes to the decision, and the only dog he can obtain is his own faithful hound. He shudders at the idea of practicing on his own dear canine companion, but it is a question between his own flesh and blood and that of a dog. He decides against the dog.


"The doctor proceeds to prepare the anesthetic, and calls upon a [black] servant to get the animal into position for the operation. The [boy] pleads for the dog, but is promptly hypnotized by the doctor and under this influence proceeds to arrange the vivisection table.

"The doctor is proceeding with the preparation of the anesthetic, when suddenly the chemicals overpower him and he falls to the ground. Then does he pass through a sequence of awful tortures. One large creature, with the head of a dog and the body of a human being, approaches him. A vision of his own beautiful dog comes before him, and then alongside appears his daughter, pleading for the life of the dog. He rises to get to the vision, but it disappears, and the dog-headed human being approaches him again, this time armed with a knife. The doctor is decapitated, and his fright in the process is pitiable. No sooner has the head of the doctor been taken off and hurled into the blazing pit than a door opens, and in walks his daughter in her nightdress. She rushes to his aid and raises him. He looks wonderingly at her and strokes her hair lovingly. He calls, and the dog appears, delighted to be befriended by her master. The curtain falls as the doctor takes his knife, contemplates it for a moment, and then hurls it through a window."





The contents of these notebooks are remarkable in their scope and completeness, and the entries are generally written in full form, in an exceptionally clear and understandable style, frequently accompanied by humorous asides and comments (a few poems and rhymes are peppered throughout the notebooks). Unlike similar personal records describing tricks, Collins has recorded his methods and information about performing the effects in a style that is anything but shorthand. Rather, the material is understandable to virtually any reasonably well-informed reader. Some descriptions are accompanied by revealing (if crude) diagrams.



A significant piece of British magic history in that Devant, at one time the financial (and perhaps artistic) savior of St. George's Hall and a partner in the Maskelyne enterprise, was fired from his position as a managing director of the company in 1915. The ticket stub laid inside this program explains how, after nearly two years away from the theater he called home, this performance – featuring none other than his old partner and boss, John Nevil Maskelyne – marked the first time Devant had set foot inside St. George's Hall since his "rupture" with the Maskelyne family and his dismissal from the company.

102. DE VEGA (Alex Stewart, 1892 - 1971). 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


122. HARTZ, Joseph Michael (1836 – 1903). **The Hartz Rising Skull**. Circa 1880s. *Papier-mâché* skull owned and used by J.M. Hartz in his stage-filling routine, "A Devil of a Hat," in which the conjurer began the performance with a bare stage holding only a few glass-topped tables, and at the conclusion took his bows amidst dozens if not hundreds of objects produced from an opera hat borrowed from a member of the audience. This skull was used at the conclusion of the routine and appears – apparently of its own volition – over the brim of the hat, due to the clockwork mechanism concealed inside the skull. Housed in a wooden and glass display case with plush cushion and hand-lettered plaque below the skull reading, "Original Hartz Rising Skull / as used in / A Devil of a Hat." Accompanied by a sheaf of documents and photographs related to the use and ownership of the skull (including two with its former owner, Richard Ritson), a modern (reprint) picture of Hartz's stage set in Professor Hoffmann's home, a VHS of the skull in operation (not tested), and with some of the documents tracing the device's provenance from Hartz down to the collection of Dr. Edwin Dawes. A unique and important association item from the show of this influential Victorian conjurer who performed in England and America.

Professor Hoffmann wrote extensively about Hartz and his Devil of a Hat routine, and very specifically about this skull in The Wizard for Nov. 1906. Hoffmann's story recounted the use of this mechanical device in the following manner: "His first improvement [on the productions] was the substitution for the doll [with] a human skull, which rose automatically from the hat, the performer standing at a distance from it, and taking no part whatever in the operation." In performance, "... an uncanny grating sound called attention to the hat. Rising by slow degrees, the skull came into view...." Hoffmann went on to write an entire chapter about Hartz in the 1911 expanded edition of his seminal work, Later Magic. In its pages he wrote:

"Among the many wonders of the magic art, not the least surprising is the fact that a single trick, in the hands of the same performer, should have held the stage as permanent attraction for nearly forty years. Such, however, was the case with Hartz's great Hat Trick.... The marvel is the greater, because at the very outset the trick was not a new one, but was merely a highly improved version of one which, in a simpler form, had already been worked by magicians for half a century or more."

The production of the skull was used as a finale to the production, as Hoffmann relates in the many pages of the book devoted to his late friend and his magic. Those pages also make clear that that Hoffmann himself had a hand in the skull's introduction to the routine: "This, as also the production of the champagne bottles, to be presently noticed, was the outcome of a suggestion of my own, made in response to Hartz's often-repeated request to give him an idea for some striking effect, no matter how impracticable it might seem."

The Coming Race was replete with imaginative stage effects and magical moments built on the stage illusions and principles developed at Maskelyne's Egyptian Hall. It was David Devant's return to London – he had been on tour in the provinces – that helped bring financial stability (and appreciative, robust audiences) to England's "New Home of Mystery," St. George's Hall.





Hoffmann, a barrister by trade, eventually gave up the law for writing and authored dozens of works on games, home amusements, and conjuring.
