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INTRODUCTION

dwin A Dawes is considered the most meticulous and prolific magic historian who has ever lived, which makes the writing of this essay an honor. And yet it is with mixed feelings that I type these words.

Frankly, I wouldn't have minded if Eddie had lived forever, and his collection had remained treasured, scrutinized, and cared for in his hometown of Anlaby, Hull in the Northeast of England. I mourn his passing not only because of the contributions he made to our art as a historian, but also as a friend. We shared a keen interest in British magical heritage, and as such, it is has been difficult to see this important collection of artifacts leave the United Kingdom.

But I have come to terms with several facts. Firstly, despite Eddie's important contributions to science and medicine (he was, after all, a noted Professor of Biochemistry at Hull University) coupled with his lifelong study of magic and miracles, Eddie never discovered the secret of immortality. But he came close, living to the age of 97 with his remarkable mind intact—writing and editing to the end in a feat of near-miraculous proportions.

Then there was Eddie's wish to put his collection "back in the river" upon his passing. This was a desire he spelled out plainly; his devoted sons Adrian and Michael followed his instructions. And so, the journey of the remarkable Dawes collection continues, albeit all across the globe.

And then there's the venue for its dispersal. Potter and Potter must be the finest specialist auction house for magicana in the world. An in person behind-the-scenes visit hosted by my friend and fellow historian Gabe Fajuri (on the occasion of the first Dawes sale) was at once astonishing and impressive. An efficient organization and focused team, along with Gabe's seemingly endless knowledge of all things old and magical, make his firm a very good choice for a magical collection of this caliber. The items themselves may be dispersed, but the beautiful catalogues (like the one you now hold) remain a record of the whole. I understand that this, too, was an important consideration for Eddie who, as an auction attendee throughout his life, was a great admirer of P&P's catalogues.

Should you be a lucky winner of one of these wonderful pieces, remember that it was a building block of one of *the truly great* magic collections. Yes, these are amazing things to put on a shelf or hang on a wall to enjoy and admire, but part of each object's history is the fact that it was curated and cared for the most remarkable magic historian of the last 100 years.

Eddie spent his life writing about the items he curated and the subject he loved. Many pieces in his collection are depicted in the remarkable Rich Cabinet series of Magicana publications. Some 50 years of drafts and notes for Eddie's Rich Cabinet articles (originally published in The Magic Circular) have kindly been donated by the Dawes family to The Magic Circle Collection. Eddie was an Honorary Vice President of the club and its official historian.

Eddie's famous "3C" maxim for collectors was "Collect, Collate, Communicate." As the newly appointed Executive Museum Curator and Head of Collections at The Magic Circle, and in closing I want to take the opportunity to do just that.



The Magic Circle collection began with a major donation by our first president, David Devant, shortly after the club's foundation in 1905. The library, museum, and archive have expanded through the years and since the establishment of The Centre for Magic Arts in 1998 these items have been housed in a purpose-built museum, library, and archive. The club's treasures were a frequent reference for Eddie in his research and writings and we were very happy to provide further images published in The Rich Cabinet Collection. With a new dynamic team in place, we are moving toward the huge task of digitizing the Circle's holdings, and one of the first archives on the list will be Eddie's notes. Although we must accomplish several major steps first—including a fundraising campaign—cataloguing the collection in this way will make it accessible to historians and researchers across the globe, and will be the ultimate form *communicating* its contents.

I acquired several items from Eddie's first sale which are now cherished parts of my own collection. Several of these I look at every day and, of course, think of my dear and brilliant friend. If each item catalogued here is treasured with a similar fondness, curiosity, and twinkle-in-the eye that inspired their previous custodians, Eddie and Amy Dawes, it's heartening to think of this sale as a sort of scattering of magical fairy-dust, each object a sparkling piece of magical history that inspires the life, work, and curiosity of its new caretaker.

1. Robert-Houdin Mystery Clock. Paris, ca. 1840s. Striking eight-day movement glass dial mystery clock. Ormoludecorated bronze case supporting a gilded bezel surrounding the clear glass dial, at the center of which sits a single arrowshaped hand. A "Second series" mystery clock; the timepiece runs and keeps time despite no apparent connection between the dial and the base. Clock chimes on the hour and half-hour. The case resting on a gilded wooden plush-covered base. Height 17 3/4". Runs and chimes but in need of service. With winding key. Lettering to glass dial well rubbed.

This clock was originally purchased by David Copperfield at auction in Paris and was obtained by Dr. Dawes from Copperfield in trade for a rare Chung Ling Soo billboard lithograph which now hangs in the International Museum and Library of the Conjuring Arts in Las Vegas.

2. ROBERT-HOUDIN, Jean Eugène (1805 – 71). Theatre Robert-Houdin Souvenir Fan. Paris, ca. 1845. Pictorial paper souvenir fan with gilt edge, distributed to audience members at the famous Theatre Robert-Houdin in Paris. The recto bears an image of the entrance to the famous magic theatre with audience members of all types clamoring to enter; the verso is printed with French verses regarding many of Robert-Houdin's most famous tricks (Second Sight, the Orange Tree, etc.). Wooden ribs. 11" wide when open. Rightmost portion of image a skillful replacement likely from another fan, rubbing and wear at ribs, image obscured on verso where repaired, possibly lacking one wooden rib.



A variety of souvenir fans were created to advertise the Theatre over the span of its existence, this being an early example. Many appeared in the Cone of Abundance, an effect in which a large cornucopia was first shown empty, and then a seemingly unending stream of articles and souvenirs was produced from within, including miniature sheets of music and these paper fans. Both Robert-Houdin and his successors produced articles in this way for distribution to spectators.



It has been said that Alexander Graham Bell was inspired in his work on the telephone by Farber's talking machine. The device was operated by its inventor using a combination of keyboard-like device and large bellows to imitate human speech. The machine was exhibited by Barnum, among other showmen.

Despite the billing here as "Blitz Junior," this bill most likely advertises a performance by Antonio. His father, Abraham, also performed as Signor Blitz, but it was Antonio who became the more famous of the two, and who was initially billed as "Junior."

18. BODIE. Walford (1869 - 1939). Archive of Bodie Research. Correspondence and Manuscripts. Compiled and written by Elliot Williams — a British entertainer who performed as "the last of the barnstormers" and as a "one man theatre" circa 1965, the archive is comprised of manuscript notes. typed stories, original research material, and all manner of information regarding the career of Bodie, the "bloodless surgeon" and self-proclaimed doctor who used electricity and other sham treatments in his stage productions to apparently cure the sick and cause other marvelous occurrences. Bodie also performed more traditional magic tricks and was frequently accompanied on stage by his son and other family members. Subjects treated include "last memories" of Bodie, the building of his manor house in Scotland, the Bodie Riot, masonic matters, Bodie's "discoveries" who became stars, and other topics. Approximately 150 pages of manuscript material and several notebooks, all apparently unpublished, much of it written and gathered in preparation for a book on Bodie by Williams. Also included are photos of Williams, later images of Bodie, press releases, radio scripts ("Contribution to 'Voice of the North'" regarding Bodie), ALSs and TLSs to Williams with memories of Bodie and his stage shows, drawings of Bodie, photographs of his gravesite, copies of original documents, periodicals, a fascinating trove of ALSs from John Hutcheson to Williams regarding Bodie, and more. All housed in two black three-ring binders. A fascinating and possibly untapped trove of material related to this curious music hall entertainer and magician.

21. CARDINI (Richard Pitchford, 1885 – 1973). Original Film Footage of Cardini Presenting Billiard Ball and Card Sleights. Canister of original 8mm Kodak home movie film footage as captured by Eddie Dawes at the home of Dr. John Henry Grossman in 1968, and featuring the famed sleight-of-hand magician presenting a series of expert sleights with billiard balls (color changes, multiplying balls, vanishes), as well as a portion of his card fanning routine while wearing the same white gloves he used at the Royal Command Performance for British royalty in 1933. Also featured are Walter Gibson and John Mulholland, with a section of the film featuring scenes from the annual Hull Fair. In the original tin canister and bearing Dr. Dawes' label. Sold together with the copyright to the footage.

It has been said that this footage is the only film extant that shows Cardini presenting certain portions of his fabled billiard ball routine.

Neatly organized in three binders. An important collection related to this significant British magician, author, and collector. Should be seen.

Also included are several paperback books of tricks featuring the Wizbit character, approximately 12 scripts from his long running BBC TV show presented to Dr. Dawes by the producer, John Fisher, and a trove of ephemera related to Daniels work with the Yorkshire Cancer Research Campaign team headed by Dr. Edwin Dawes. A very large archive of material, well-kept, and chronicling nearly the entire public career of this famous and well-liked magician.





86. HOUDINI, Harry (Erik Weisz, 1874 – 1926). Six Houdini TLSs to Magician Alex De Vega. New York, 1922 – 25. Six TLSs from the famous escape artist to his fellow magician based in Glasgow who assisted with investigations into fraudulent spirit mediums; Houdini writes about his forthcoming work, *A Magician Among the Spirits* (in which De Vega appears), mentions family matters, ("You villain, you never told me that you had a baby. I must take off my hat, as you are a better production artist than I am." "How is your dear mother, your good wife, and your old self?"), thanking De Vega for sending clippings and magazines regarding magic and spiritualism (from *Light, John Bull*, and elsewhere), testimony before congress ("Was in Washington last week delivering a lecture on Spiritualism..."), De Vega's investigations of spiritualism in Crewe ("Will you please send me anything and everything you can in regard to spirit photography?" [underlined in ink by Houdini]), and other interesting matters, ("I may possibly sue the editor of Popular Radio and shall go to my solicitors regarding same." Paul Valadon was tempted away from the confines of the Egyptian Hall by illusionist Harry Kellar, who made overtures that Valadon might succeed him – then the most famous magician in America – once the elder conjurer retired. Valadon did eventually leave England for the New World as part of Kellar's company, and brought with him far more than the sleight-of-hand tricks he was known for. It was the secret of Maskelyne's levitation Kellar was after, and by adding Valadon to his company, the wily American wizard learned its innermost workings. (Maskelyne had been unwilling to sell the rights to the trick despite Kellar's persistence.) Valadon never succeeded Kellar, dying in poverty in 1913. But his departure from the Egyptian Hall and betrayal of the Maskelynes gave way to what would, with several important refinements, become one of the most celebrated stage illusions of all time.

105. KELLAR, Harry (1849 – 1922). Kellar ALS to Harry Houdini. Dated Jan. 24, 1921 in Kellar's own hand, he writes to Houdini on his trademark lithographed letterhead regarding a range of interesting topics. In part: "Hearty congratulations on your being called to lecture before the Club of Odd Volumes [sic] of Harvard College ..." "...why should they call it Kellar's match trick? I only spoke of it [to] Thayer & then I told him it was Houdini's trick." He concludes by discussing Alexander: "I wrote to Alexander & advised him to cut out the exposes of other methods for doing the Crystal Gazing ... He said he ... never exposes anything he did not originate. In other words he did not expose other's inventions." One folded 8vo sheet, boldly SIGNED "Your friend Harry Kellar."







All neatly kept and organized, with one scrapbook of effects divided into sections by genre, separated by hand-lettered tabs (card magic, silk magic, rope tricks, etc.). Many entries include finely rendered pen-and-ink illustrations explaining the working of various tricks and gimmicks. A few images hand-colored. The largest books small folios. A very good record of not only Marsh's own work and interests, but magic in England and abroad from approximately 1910 - 1960.







Toole Stott writes at length about Hill and his station as a "hack writer" who produced handy works at the demand of booksellers. According to the bibliographer, Harry Price was the first to recognize Hill's work as a contribution to the literature of conjuring as it includes – mixed in among many other recipes and chemical formulas for toothpaste and the like – scientific methods for after-dinner tricks, among them ways to make a candle light of its own accord, an apple dance on a table, and how to turn water into wine. This was one of four books selected by Dr. Dawes at David Findlay's request and "bought-in" at the James B. Findlay Sotheby's Sale held on 5-6 July, 1979. The full story is recounted in The Rich Cabinet Collection Vol V pp.1948-1953.
