1. **Caille Bros. 1 Cent Play Ball Baseball Countertop Trade Stimulator.** Caille, ca. 1910. Ornate nickel-plated cabinet with baseball protruding from the front. Penny trade stimulator with original reel strip and pay-cards. This is a conversion of Caille's Tiger model with the pay-cards and casting altered. The top payout is 30 cents, represented by a tiger, followed by a home run, with a 20 cent payout. 18 x 14 x 12". Working. Minor age-related wear; an attractive and rare machine. Without lock on rear door (unlocked). Rubin, Drop Coin Here, p. 43.

Replaced back door (no lock), chipping to front lower corner of cabinet; scattered wear. Not tested. Third-party transportation required.



This rare and unusual sign for Pepsi-Cola was made for various cities or towns, and were most likely used in public places such as diners, bus stations, or gas stations.

61. "The Empire" Die-Cut, Embossed Large Trade Card Featuring a Wright Brothers-Style Airplane. [Germany, ca. 1900s-10s]. Color trade card with "Compliments of The Empire Plymouth Wisconsin" at top with an image of a boy in a sailor's suite on an airplane surrounded by roses. Sight 11 3/4 x 17". Matted and framed under glass. Frame size 19 3/4 x 23 3/4". Upper corner of card is creased, center portion of cross beam of wing near boy's legs apparently missing a small portion. Fine. Not examined out of frame. A rare image. The Empire in Plymouth, WI was a commercial building that housed a dry goods store, a drug store, and a funeral parlor (presumably businesses came and went over the years). In 1924, there was a famous theft of liquor from Badger Drugs in the building (booze was legally sold by druggists during Prohibition).
