



1. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). **The Amazing Kreskin's Diaries and Datebooks.** 1940s – 70s. Seven bound volumes owned and kept by the well-known television personality, mentalist, and magician who billed himself for nearly seven decades as "The Amazing Kreskin." Included are diaries for 1947, 1949, 1953, 1956, 1962, 1965, and 1973.

The earliest diaries, from Kreskin's teenage years, include entries on nearly every day, typically one or two sentences in length. Inside the front cover of one he describes himself in as a "magician and musician," and the pages are filled with personal data and ideas for his earliest performances ("Uncle Frank had an idea for dancing in my show"; "Saw Dubois ... had an idea for floating light." "Received Abbott's [magic] Catalog today – best one yet."). The 1949 diary includes his New Year's resolutions, including "To get my name and picture in the newspaper. (Good publicity)" and to "always keep up with my – magic, hypnotism, music, and writing."

The 1956 diary contains more detailed entries, describing conditions under which he worked when performing a "rare show," commenting on Dunninger's television appearances, describing his mood and his interactions with his family, and making more general observations about magic and mentalism, including these two prophetic lines: "Can't wait to get on TV." And "No such thing as hypnosis!"

The 1962 diary/datebook reflects a more organized and professional Kreskin, listing dates of performances at high schools, social events, and country clubs, along with to-do lists and personal information. Laid in are dozens of loose notes, business cards, pieces of mail, and notes inked in Kreskin's hand.

The 1965 and 1973 datebooks are more sparsely completed, with most entries being notes of shows, important dates, and reminders of anniversaries and birthdays. Notes include reminders about TV appearances ("Johnny Carson TV" and many others), casino shows at Harrah's, and reminders of private appearances across the United States.

In sum, a revealing (if scattered) record of a life spent in show business, dating from Kreskin's formative years through some of his most prominent and successful, in the 1970s. A personal and revealing record.

2. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Talk Show Performance Photo Archive. Predominantly 1960s-1970s. Large photo album filled with staged and candid photos of Kreskin both as a guest on the numerous television programs he appeared on, as well as a host on his own programs. Photos illustrate Kreskin's popularity, showcasing excited audiences, willing participants, and celebrity hosts alike, including Regis Philbin, Johnny Carson, and Howard Stern. Approx. 100 photos. Includes grouping of framed photographs.

3. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). The Amazing Kreskin's Lifetime Show Archive and Records. 1950s -2000s. A collection of thousands of typed and handwritten index cards chronicling the professional appearances of The Amazing Kreskin, kept and maintained by him over the course of decades, and providing a chronicle of his entire career in show business. The cards, neatly typed and maintained, describe each performance given by Kreskin, and pertinent data related to it: location, fee, agent's commission, manager's commission, length of the program, and other gratuities provided or received.

Appearances recorded include Kreskin's many hundreds of television appearances on Johnny Carson and with other hosts, performances at performing arts centers and at casinos in Atlantic City and Las Vegas, private parties, college shows, cameos on television and in films, speaker series performances, and virtually every other type of venue conceivable.

Housed in three metal card file cabinets and four small file boxes, the records are all neatly organized both by year and together with a duplicate set of records organized by location. Not checked for completeness; a few gaps are evident.

In sum, a remarkable record of shows from the career of one of the twentieth century's best-known mentalists and mindreaders, encompassing almost the entire arc of his career, from beginning and amateur performances to worldwide television broadcasts, to personal appearances, casino shows, and beyond. The only archive of its type we have offered, and a particularly fascinating look at the business side of show business from an entertainer whose career spanned nearly seven decades.

4. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Chronological Scrapbooks of The Amazing Kreskin's Career. This collection comprises approximately 30 meticulously assembled scrapbooks chronicling the professional career of The Amazing Kreskin, renowned mentalist and performer, spanning from 1958 to 2014. Crossing more than five decades, the scrapbooks document Kreskin's journey, highlighting his television appearances, stage performances, media coverage, fan interactions, and personal reflections.

Condition varies, good to near fine with edge wear consistent with age and display. This archive contains dozens of printed multiples never distributed to the public.

7. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Vault of Kreskin Produced Games, Milton Bradley, Fundex, 3M, mid to late 20th century. Included are multiple factory-sealed copies of Kreskin's iconic board games from the 1970s and 1980s. such as Kreskin's ESP, Celtic Oracle, and Kreskin's Krystal, each designed to simulate the mystifying experience of psychic exploration and telepathic tests. These games are accompanied by multiple factory-sealed copies of The Best Moments of "The Amazing Kreskin". In addition to the Kreskinbranded titles, the lot includes a small selection of non-Kreskin vintage board games, all unopened and in very good condition. Approx. 50 in total. 8. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). The Amazing Kreskin Television Appearance Video Archive. Over 100 DVDs from Kreskin's personal collection, composed of television appearances, interviews, and media mentions of The Amazing Kreskin. This collection was personally assembled by Kreskin himself over the course of his long and prolific career, spanning decades of television—from classic 1960s and '70s talk shows to cable news spots, comedy sketches, and international features. Appearances include *The Tonight Show, Late Night, The Mike Douglas Show, Larry King Live*, and numerous specials, documentaries, and news segments that reference or feature Kreskin's work. 9. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Collection of Early Personal Kreskin Ephemera. 1940s – 50s. Selection of personal documents and memorabilia documenting the formative years of George Joseph Kresge Jr., who would go on to world fame as "The Amazing Kreskin," including original grade reports from Grover Cleveland High School, and annotated yearbooks from Kreskin's high school years featuring photographs and classmate inscriptions, many of which praise Kresge's budding abilities as an entertainer.

Featuring a script for a 1969 episode of *Playboy After Dark*, hosted by Hugh Hefner and featuring Kreskin, along with original television proposal, outlining a future 1980s planned program, *Kreskin's Quest*, as well as early and final typescript and annotated drafts of Kreskin's autobiographical work, "The Adventures of the Amazing Kreskin"(2020), featuring inked marginalia and edit notes throughout, along with "The Amazing Kreskin," a screenplay, by Michael Fishman and Eric Gold, a complete film script with character notes and edits.

14. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Kreskin Press and Publicity Collection. Bulk 21st century. An "Amazing Kreskin" press kit filled with promotional materials, including accolades, DVD mentions, Kreskin headshots, and photos with notable celebrities like John Waters and Regis Philbin. The lot also includes publicity photos, some signed from across Kreskin's career, 35mm film negatives, slides, and photo masters of headshots and show promos. Includes binder with testimonials, printed photographs, interviews, performance/book reviews, and more.

Twenty-one pairs of mostly acetate frames owned by the "World's Foremost Mentalist." Styles include oversized, cat eye, and browline frames in black, tortoise shell, and gradient variations. Can be seen in many of Kreskin's numerous TV appearances or stage performances. Scattered scratches and wear, indicative of age and use. Lenses are missing from the majority. Includes portrait photographs of the mentalist.

17. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). The Amazing Kreskin's Stage Worn Wardrobe Collection. Twelve tailored suits and separates owned by George Kreskin Jr, with a majority purchased from Jos. A. Bank Clothiers and tailored to Kreskin's exact measurements. The lot features multiple modern and vintage silhouettes with patterned and textured suit jackets, pants, and vests. Single and double-breasted jackets and sport coats in wool, wool blend, and suede. Suits show signs of fabric wear from age and use, but overall, very good condition. Measurements upon request.

18. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). The Amazing Kreskin's Suits and Tuxedos. Collection of 20 personally tailored suits and tuxedos, stage worn for performances throughout The Amazing Kreskin's long career on stage and screen. Includes a pair of Italian-made dress shoes. Expected fabric wear from age and use, very good condition overall. Measurements upon request.

19. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Kreskin's Q&A Lap Desk/Writing Board. Circa 1980. A folding lap desk with collapsible screens on the front and sides, owned and used by Kreskin for his performance of the famous question-andanswer portion of his evening shows. The desk was used to shield Kreskin's writing from prying eyes as he made notes and comments regarding thought-of questions from the audience and delivered his answers. Well made from a sturdy but lightweight plastic material, including plastic hinges. 9 ½ x 12 x 5" (open). With a cloth carrying bag and schematic drawings for the manufacture of the desk, and sold together with three crudely made cardboard models hinged together with gaff or duct tape. Kreskin's regular performances required virtually no special props; this lap desk is one of the only custommade articles required for his shows. In the tradition of many mentalists before him, the Q&A portion of his performance was a highlight of Kreskin's appearances.

20. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Kreskin's "Tonight Show" Presidential Prediction Safe. A grey metal safe owned and used by Kreskin to house his prediction of the 2012 American presidential election. The safe was delivered to host Jimmy Fallon on *The Tonight Show* in 2011, and its contents were revealed on the day following the 2012 election. Sold together with a photo of Kreskin presenting the safe to Fallon, and another image showing him revealing the prediction on the show, together with Fallon, Pharrell Williams, and Black Thought (lead singer of the show's house band, The Roots). Approximately 14 x 16 x 16". Together with a smaller box also used as part of the presidential prediction, with Kreksin's business card affixed to the lid. Third-party transportation or pickup suggested. From the collection of The Amazing Kreskin.

21. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Kreskin's Late-Night Show Appearance Gifts. Late 20th/21st Century. Gifts include a New York Knicks basketball jersey with personalized "Late Night" across the back shoulders (as new with tags), given by Jimmy Fallon. Three t-shirts are also included from Kreskin's appearances on both Late Night with David Letterman and Jimmy Fallon. As a staple in the world of latenight television, starting from the late 1960s, The Amazing Kreskin was featured in hundreds of talk show episodes from The Tonight Show starring Johnny Carson, Playboy After Dark, to Howard Stern and Live with Regis and Kathie Lee. All marked size L. Includes appearance-related photographs. Light fabric wear, lint adherence.

22. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). Kreskin's Collection of Event Merchandise and Memorabilia. 20th - 21st century. A collection of appearance and performance memorabilia, including t-shirts, sweatshirts, artwork, and signed photos, some fan-made tributes, some official, and some gifts from friends/admirers, all acquired by The Amazing Kreskin over his career. Includes appearance apparel from The International Brotherhood of Magicians (1994), The Friars Club Roast of Jerry Lewis (2006), and New Jersey Horror Con and Film Festival (2017). Along with Kreskin t-shirts sold at shows and signed photos and artwork from notable figures, including cartoonist Randy Bish, President Ronald Regan, and artist John R. Elliot. Areas of discoloration and general fabric wear throughout garments. Various sizes, largest frame 19 x 13". Condition varies.

Wristwatches from George Kreskin Jr's personal wardrobe, with a few watches by Stauer and Steinhausen. Leather bands. The lot also includes a collection of the mentalist's cufflinks and other personal jewelry, including a rosary, finger rings, and lapel pins. Storage box measures 3 x 10 x 7".

25. KRESKIN (George Kresge, 1935-2024). The Great Buck Howard Movie Memorabilia. 2000s - 2010s. A collection of personal memorabilia relating to The Great Buck Howard (2008), the Tom Hanks-produced feature film loosely based on the life and career of mentalist George Kresge, better known as "The Amazing Kreskin". Includes a manuscript copy of Kreskin Confidential: The World's Greatest Mentalist Speaks Out, with closing credits of the 2008 film. Promotional photographs from the press run of the film are also included, featuring candid and posed shots with stars Tom and Collin Hanks, as well as John Malkovich, who portrays Buck Howard, the Kreskin-like character in the film. Together with a "Buck Howard" show poster and with red carpet photos of the era featuring other celebs, including Zack Galifianakis and Steve Carell from premieres, including Dinner for Schmucks (2010), where Kreskin is also referenced.

Hand-painted green, brown, and orange wand by Tayade housed in a later felt-lined presentation box (1970s), accompanied by a well-worn Walter C. Thomas Co., top hat, ca. late 19th century. Inside the hat, the maker's name is present in gold lettering. The interior silk lining has been damaged and torn, with outer rubbing and wear to fabric, consistent with age and use.

When reopened, the ball is resting in the glass. $9 \frac{3}{4} \times 4 \frac{1}{4} \times 8$ ". From the collection of The Amazing Kreskin.

41. Curious Cubes. Sun Valley, CA: Milson-Worth, ca. 1980s. Twelve wooden cubes bearing playing card pips randomly in a cabinet rearrange themselves to reveal a selected playing card. Cabinet 6 \(^3\lambda\) x 9 \(^1\lambda\) x 2 \(^1\lambda\). Minor wear to cubes. Finely finished. From the library of famed mentalist The Amazing Kreskin.


42. Blue Phantom. Alhambra: Owen Magic Supreme, ca. 1955. A single blue checker travels through a stack of yellow checkers when covered with a decorated tube. Natural finish base. Height 16 1/2". From the collection of famed mentalist The Amazing Kreskin.

43. Buried Treasure (Bean Box). Colon: Abbott's Magic Mfg. (Arturo), ca. 1970. A borrowed, marked coin appears in the smallest of three nested wooden boxes lacquered in bright colors. Largest box 5 x 6 x 6 ". A few scratches to paint. From the collection of The Amazing Kreskin.

46. Mineral Prediction Chest. 1990s. Finely finished wooden chest is opened to reveal twelve samples of uncommon minerals mounted on small jewelry pedestals. A spectator chooses any sample and removes it from the box. The mentalist removes the upper tray from the chest to reveal a folded billet inside that correctly predicts the free choice. With key. Chest 11 3/4 x 6 x 6". Very minor wear to finish. From the collection of The Amazing Kreskin.

47. Perfect Net Bag. Israel: Guy Bavli, 1990s. White net bag suspended from a chromed metal handle allows the performer to force billets, bills, or chips. With original instructions, accessories (chips, stickers), and carrying bag. Handle 14 x 8". From the collection of The Amazing Kreskin.

48. Ghost Hands. Colon, MI: Abbott's, 1960s. A pair of white cotton gloves coated in luminous paint to produce "ghost hands" that glow and float about in mid-air in a darkened theater or séance room. In the original printed Abbott's bag, with an advertising flyer and miscellaneous Abbott-printed instructions for other effects.

Beatrice replaced Houdini's brother Theo (Hardeen), in the magic and escape act the brothers developed, and continued to play an integral role in her husband's career even after retreating from the stage in her later years. The couple struggled together for years, beginning a slow and steady climb up the ladder of fame by working together in circus, dime museums, and in virtually every other venue conceivable. They finally hit the "big time" in Europe just after the dawn of the twentieth century, remaining devoted partners until Houdini's unexpected passing on October 31, 1926.







273. ADAIR. lan (1940 - 2024). lan Adair's Props. Wands. and Top Hat. Including a metal jumping wand, an unusual gimmicked wand with tips that appear or disappear at will, a well-worn folding top hat used by Adair, one of his Van Heusen dress collars, a crackle finish cigarette case with flap (a la a Flap Card Box), and a walking stick with engraved knob owned and used by Adair. Together with the certificate for his Cecil Lyle award presented to Adair by London's Magic Circle in 1990. A television performer, kid show magician, prolific author, and prominent dealer in conjuring supplies, Adair's career in magic spanned the 1950s to the 2020s. He is best remembered for his enormous output of tricks and books as the second in command at the Supreme Magic Company of Bideford, Devon, in the United Kingdom. Absentee Bids – Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. will use reasonable efforts to carry out written bids given to us prior to the sale for the convenience of clients who are not present at the auction in person. Bids must be placed in U.S. dollars. If we receive written bids on a particular lot for identical amounts, and these are the highest bids on the lot at the auction, it will be sold to the person whose written bid was received and accepted first. Execution of written bids is a free service undertaken subject to other commitments at the time of the sale and Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. does not not accept liability for failing to execute a written bid or for errors and omissions in connection with such written bid(s).

Telephone Bids – If a prospective buyer makes arrangements with us prior to the commencement of the sale we will use reasonable efforts to contact said prospective buyer to enable them to participate in the bidding by telephone and we do not accept liability for failure to do so or for errors and omissions in connection with telephone bidding.

The reserve will not exceed the low estimate of the lot. Reserves are agreed upon with consignors or, in the absence thereof, the absolute discretion of Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. The auctioneer may open

the bidding on any lot below the reserve by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The auctioneer may continue to bid on behalf of the seller up to the amount of the reserve, either by placing consecutive bids or by placing bids in response to other bidders. With respect to lots that are offered without reserve, unless there are already competing bids, the auctioneer, in his or her discretion, will generally open the bidding at half of the low estimate for the lot. In the absence of a bid at that level, the auctioneer may proceed backwards at his or her discretion until a bid is recognized, and then continue up from that amount.

Auctioneer's Discretion – The auctioneer has the right at his or her absolute and sole discretion to refuse any bid, to advance the bidding in such a manner as he or she may decide, to withdraw any lot, and in the case of error or dispute, and whether during or after the sale, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding, to cancel the sale or to reoffer and resell the item in dispute. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sale record is conclusive.

Successful Bid – The highest bidder acknowledged by the auctioneer will be the purchaser. In the case of a tie bid, the winning bidder will determined by the auctioneer at his or her sole discretion. In the event of a dispute between bidders, the auctioneer has final discretion to determine the successful bidder or to reoffer the lot in dispute. Title passes upon the fall of the auctioneer's hammer to the highest acknowledged bidder subject to the Conditions of Sale set forth herein, and the bidder assumes full risk and responsibility.

AFTER THE SALE

Buyer's Premium – In addition to the hammer price, the buyer agrees to pay Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. a buyer's premium of 20%, and the applicable sales tax added to the final total.

Payment – The buyer must pay the entire amount due (including the hammer price, buyer's premium, all applicable taxes and other charges) no later than 5 p.m. on the seventh (7) business day following the sale. Payment in U.S. dollars may be made with cash; bank check or cashier's check drawn on a U.S. bank; money order; or wire transfer unless other arrangements are made with Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. Potter aAuctions, Inc. reserves the right to hold merchandise purchased by personal check until the check has cleared the bank. The purchaser agrees to pay Potter and Potter Auctions, Inc. a handling charge of \$50 for any check dishonored by the drawee. In the event buyer desires to pay by using a credit card, a convenience fee equaling 2.5% of the entire amount due shall be added to the buyer's invoice.

Shipping Terms - By Potter & Potter. Choice of packing and shipping method is strictly at the discretion of Potter and Potter Auctions. P&P generally provides in house shipping via FedEx or USPS to winning bidders.

Please allow 3-4 weeks for delivery.

Customer's obligation to inspect and report claims. Potter and Potter professionally and safely packs and ships thousands of items every year, and insurance is provided for successful purchasers. In the unlikely event that damage or loss occurs, these are subject to our insurance carrier's rules and limitations. Customers are required to report, in writing, any damage or loss within 72 hours of receipt of merchandise. The carrier's delivery record shall be conclusive as to this matter.

Correcting Shipping Address and report of non-receipt: Prior to shipping winning lots, customers must provide Potter and Potter with a current and accurate shipping address. Once an order has been shipped, any address changes or updates are subject to a \$25.00 return to Sender fee, in addition to shipping charges.

In the event an item is lost during transit, it is customer's obligation to report non-receipt within 7 days of the date on which the item(s) were shipped.

Third-party shipping. Certain large, high-value, and fragile items will require the services of a professional packing and transportation company, or pick-up directly from our gallery. We suggest that you contact our Shipping Department before the sale for advice on the shipping and handling requirements that apply to the lots of interest to you.

If third-party shipping is chosen by the buyer or required by Potter & Potter, the buyer will arrange for removal of the merchandise from P&P within 15 days following the sale and must communicate and coordinate removal arrangements with P&P during regular business hours (Monday – Friday, 9am – 5pm).

Arrangements for third-party transportation are the responsibility of the buyer. We will not be responsible for the acts or omissions of carriers and packers whether recommended or not by us. Property will not be released to the shipper without the buyer's written consent and until payment has been made in full. Unless otherwise agreed, all purchases should be removed by the 15th day following the sale.

Risk of loss or damage in shipment. Any risk of loss or damage to the shipment through a third party carrier, once the item is removed from Potter and Potter, is at the risk of the buyer, and Potter & Potter is not liable for loss or damage of these items.

Ship to address. The winning bidder is responsible for providing Potter & Potter with an accurate address for the order destination as well as specific instructions for delivery.

Shipping costs. Shipping costs include charges for labor, materials, insurance, as well as actual shipper's fees. Buyer agrees to reimburse Potter & Potter the difference if actual shipper's fees exceed the invoice amount.

Storage fees. Potter & Potter will charge a storage fee of \$50 per week for any orders awaiting payment and/or removal for more than 15 days following the auction date. This cost shall constitute a lien against such property, which may be removed to a public warehouse at the risk, account, and expense of the purchaser.

International shipping. Potter and Potter ships internationally. All shipments will include an itemized invoice with the actual and correct purchase totals including the buyer's premium and shipping cost. International buyers are responsible for knowing their country's laws on importing items as well as paying all customs and duties fees on purchased items.

Non-Payment - If we do not receive payment in full, in good cleared funds, within seven (7) business days following the sale, we are entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following measures, in addition to any additional actions available to us by law: (1) to impose a late charge of one and a half percent (1.5%) per thirty (30) days of the total purchase price, prorated to commence on the date of the sale; (2) to hold the defaulting buyer liable for the total amount due and to begin legal proceedings for its recovery together with interest, legal fees and costs to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law; (3) to rescind the sale; (4) to resell the property publicly or privately with such terms as we find appropriate; (5) to resell the property at public auction without reserve, and with the purchaser liable for any deficiency, cost, including handling charges, the expenses of both sales, our commission on both sales at our regular rate, all other charges due hereunder and incidental damages. In addition, a defaulting purchaser will be deemed to have granted us a security interest in, and we may retain as collateral security for such purchaser's obligations to us, any property in our possession owned by such purchaser. At our option, payment will not be deemed to have been made in full until we have collected funds represented by checks, or in the case of bank or cashier's checks, we have confirmed their authenticity: (6) to offset against any amount owed; (7) to not allow any bids at any upcoming auction by or on behalf of the buyer; (8)to take other action as we find necessary or appropriate.

Abandoned Property - In accordance with the Illinois Revised Uniform Unclaimed Property Act (765 ILCS 1026/15-191 et seq.), any property not collected within six months after an auction's conclusion will be considered abandoned. This applies to all property, whether associated with a settled invoice or a previously listed and unsold consignment. Potter & Potter Auctions reserves the right to treat abandoned property as it sees fit and act in its sole discretion, and may resell, discard, donate, or retain the abandoned property. To facilitate timely removal, the auction house will issue three written communications before determining a property as abandoned. A final notice will be sent once six months passes, confirming the forfeiture of ownership rights. No refunds, payments, or future credits will be issued for abandoned property


