Two original offset lithograph posters by René Gruau, created to celebrate the 150th anniversary of Rimini's famed sea-baths on the Adriatic coast. *Bagni di Rimini* (1993) features a playful, fashion-forward mermaid holding an umbrella emblazoned with the event's dates, her tail splashing. *Rimini* (2000) commemorates the same milestone, issued by the Comune di Rimini's Assessorato al Turismo, highlighting the resort town's reputation for leisure, beaches, and vibrant culture.
